Special thanks must go to Heather Marten, who arranged bookings, liaised with the venue host regarding numbers, meals and special dietary requirements and, with the help of Rhonda Jewell, faced the daunting challenge of seating arrangements for the dinner.

Mons. Frank Marriott travelled to Melbourne to meet with and the Venerable Thich Phuoc Tan and to finalise arrangements for him to come as our guest speaker. Mons. Frank is a great networker and ambassador for the dinner and many individuals and groups respond enthusiastically to his invitation to attend.

Frank, in partnership with Heri Febriyanto, was instrumental in the establishment of the BIC in 2014, when Bendigo was shaken by the hostility generated by the proposal to build a mosque. He has worked tirelessly to build positive, harmonious relationships between people of different faiths in our community, particularly among young people. Mons. Frank is a great networker and encourager and much of the success of the Bendigo Interfaith Council can be attributed to his efforts. Although no longer Chair or a committee member of the BIC, he will continue to provide his support and wise counsel for our work. We are most grateful for all that he has done to promote interfaith harmony in the City of Greater Bendigo.

The dinner also marked the handover to new office bearers. Judy Causon has moved from the position of Secretary to Chair of the Bendigo Interfaith Council. Heri Febriyanto continues as Deputy Chair, while Shivali Chatley is our new Secretary. Heather Marten will continue to serve as Treasurer,

with Fiona Gardner as Assistant Treasurer. We are very appreciative for the support of Rhonda Jewell, who volunteers as Minute Secretary - and does much more besides.

The membership of the BIC decision-making committee is flexible, as the representation from our participating groups sometimes changes. Those represented are Baha'i, Buddhist, Christian, Hindu, Islamic and Jewish faiths, as well as the Victoria Police, Remembrance Parks Central Victoria and the City of Greater Bendigo.

We appreciate the hospitality of Bendigo Community Health, who provide us with a venue for our monthly meetings.
